The Parking Commission was created under Section 7-14-46, M.C.A., and Commission Resolution No. 1676, adopted by the City Commission on May 8, 1974, as amended by Commission Resolution No. 1839, adopted by the City Commission on November 24, 1976, and Commission [Resolution No. 3803](#), adopted by the City Commission on June 6, 2005.

The Parking Commission is a seven-member administrative board and also advises the City Commission regarding parking and fines in the "B-3" zoned area of the city. Under statutory provisions, members of

the board are appointed by the Mayor, with the approval of the City Commission, to staggered four-year terms. In the past, every effort has been made to appoint business people who have been assessed for SID No. 565, which provided the funding for the five off-street parking lots over which the Parking Commission has control.

The Parking Commission has the authority to purchase land and may hold title to that property. Under the provisions of Commission Resolution No. 3803, adopted by the Commission on June 6, 2005, the Parking Commission was given power to regulate off street parking in "B-3" zoning districts and residential parking permit areas only.
